The collected data is coded and refined in SPSS version and regression as a statistical tool to analyze the data and test research hypotheses.


Statistical Analysis of Data

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RESULTS&DISCUSSION

This study shows that effective teaching depends not only on a teacher's knowledge base, but also on the method and style of the teacher's communication skills. The findings of Cohort Nominate (2016) are also in line with this study, as he concludes that teaching is often considered to be only 50% knowledge and 50% interpersonal or communication skills, and again, it is not necessary for teachers to have good knowledge but teachers do have good communication skills.
